e all like affirmation when something positive happens. SoSA was blessed to receive some important recognition, earlier this month, as a truly unique and successful nonprofit.

GuideStar and Charity Navigator are the two prominent charity watch-dog organizations that evaluate the performance of thousands of nonprofits across the country. The purpose of both of these groups is to offer donors information on the accountability, transparency, and concrete results of the many charities seeking their support. If you have ever checked, you will recall that SoSA repeatedly receives the highest ranking from both of these organizations.

We recently received a special letter from Charity Navigator congratulating us on earning their 7th consecutive 4-star annual rating. This is Charity Navigator's highest possible rating and verifies that SoSA exceeds industry standards and outperforms most other charities. Only 3% of all charities rated in the country achieve this ranking seven years in a row.

That is something of which we can all be proud – and we are. But what really sets us apart is that this was

achieved by the faithful way we conduct this ministry on a daily basis. It came about because of who we are, what we do, and how we do it. This recognition also represents your affirmation that your trust and confidence in SoSA is



well placed. That's nice to know don't you think?

I personally think so highly of this ministry that I gave it six years as a volunteer and then 22 years as a staff member. My time on staff, however, will come to an end on December 31. After that, Lynette Johnson will take over as Executive Director and lead SoSA to new heights and accomplishments. 


