Scope and Sequence

Year 1: Old Testament

THEME: Trust and faith in the God who always provides for our needs.

Day 1: Hospitality

Abraham and Sarah prepare a meal for unexpected guests (Genesis 18:1-15)

Key Verse: Is anything too wonderful for God? (Genesis 18:14a)

Day 2: Trickery

Esau sells his birthright for a bowl of stew (Genesis 25:29-34)

Key Verse: Teach us to count our days, that we may gain a wise heart. (Psalm 90:12)

Day 3: Obedience

The Hebrew people eat a quick meal before leaving Egypt (Exodus 13:3-10)

Key Verse: Do not fear, for I am with you. (Isaiah 43:5a)

Day 4: The Miraculous

God provides manna and quail in the desert (Exodus 16)

Key Verse: I will sing of your steadfast love, O Lord, forever. (Psalm 89:1)

Day 5: Hunger

A poor mom shares her food with Elijah (1 Kings 17:8-16)

Key Verse: You shall eat plenty and be satisfied and praise the name of the Lord your God. (Joel 2:26a)

Year 2: New Testament

THEME: God's abundant, and often unexpected, welcome.

Day 1: Breakfast

After his resurrection, Jesus prepares breakfast for his disciples on the beach (John 21:1-13)

Key verse: "I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you." (Romans 1:8)

Day 2: Lunch

Jesus has lunch with a tax collector (Luke 19:1-10)

Key verse: "Love your neighbor as yourself." (Mark 12:31)

Day 3: Dinner

Jesus has dinner at the home of his friends (Luke 10:38-42)

Key verse: "Live in harmony with one another." (Romans 12:16)

Day 4: Midnight Snack

Jesus tells a story about a midnight visitor (Luke 11:5-13)

Key verse: "Welcome one another, as Christ has welcomed you." (Romans 15:7)

Day 5: Party!

Jesus tells a story about a big party (Luke 14:15-23)

Key verse: "Whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God." (1 Corinthians 10:31)
